Directions Tool Help Guide





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Overview

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT)'s Directions tool is designed to deliver driving directions through the project area based on construction status. Users can enter a date of travel, starting address, choose from a predefined list of points of interest, or select the general direction of travel. The tool will calculate the fastest available route based on anticipated construction activities during the travel period, and return a visual map displaying the route with turn by turn driving directions.

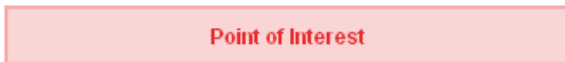


Key Web Site Controls:

Select a starting point within the **project limits**. The Project Limits displays a map highlighting the area where the routing will occur.




The Starting Point and Ending Point buttons allow the user to select a point of entry into, and point of exit from, the Project Limits.




The Point of Interest controls give a list of starting and/or ending locations for the user to choose from.

C. Enter a Wisconsin address within the **project limits**.

The Address input feature allows the user to input a specific address within the project limits.

Zoom Out  This tool zooms out on the data of the map for a less detailed view.


- Click on the **Zoom Out** button
- Click on the map to zoom to a pre-defined level, or
- To zoom to a specific area, click and hold the left mouse button and drag to form a rectangle around the desired area. Once the rectangle surrounds the desired area, release the left mouse button to zoom out.

Zoom In  This tool zooms in on the data of the map for a more detailed view.

Click on the **Zoom In** button

Click on the map to zoom to a pre-defined level, or

To zoom to a specific area, click and hold the left mouse button and then drag to form a rectangle around a desired area. Once the rectangle surrounds the desired area, release the left mouse button to zoom in.

Pan  This tool shifts the map North, South, West or East, depending on the direction selected.

Click on the **Pan** button

- Click on the map and hold the left mouse button and then drag in the direction you want to shift the map. Once the map has shifted in the desired direction, release the left mouse button



Show Entire Route



This tool zooms to the route, showing the entire route on the map. This could be a more or less detailed view of the map depending on how long the route is.

Getting Directions

Starting and Ending Point

There are three different options from which to select a starting and ending point.

Option A – Select Corridor

To select from a specific corridor, click on the “Starting Point” by the “A” category.

1 Start Fill in A, B, or C as your starting point

A. Select a starting point within the project limits.

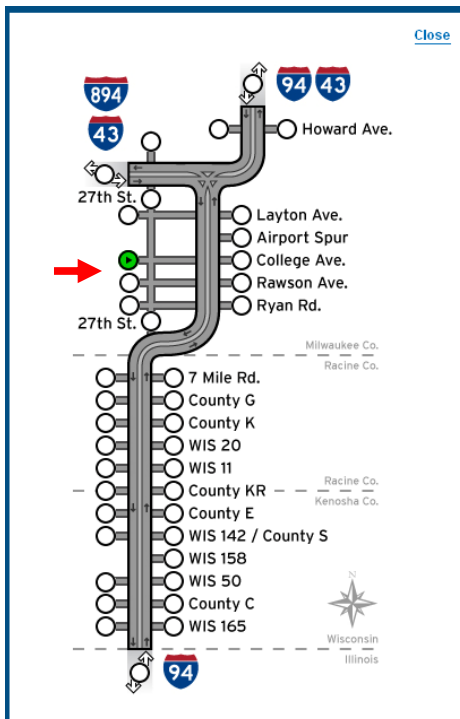
Starting Point

B. Select a point of interest near the corridor.

Point of Interest

C. Enter a Wisconsin address within the project limits.

Address, City



This will pop-up an image of all the entry options to select from, within the project area. Click on the circle to select the starting point. This will return to the website, highlighting and replacing the “Starting Point” with the name of the selected area and direction traveling.

To change the “Starting Point”, click on the Option A button again.

To return to the website without selecting an entering location, click on “Close” or click anywhere outside the image.

The same process applies to selecting an Ending Point.



Selection Example: Starting Point button will be replaced by: “Enter at COLLEGE AVE. traveling East.” Ending Point button will be replaced by: “Exit at RYAN ROAD traveling East.”

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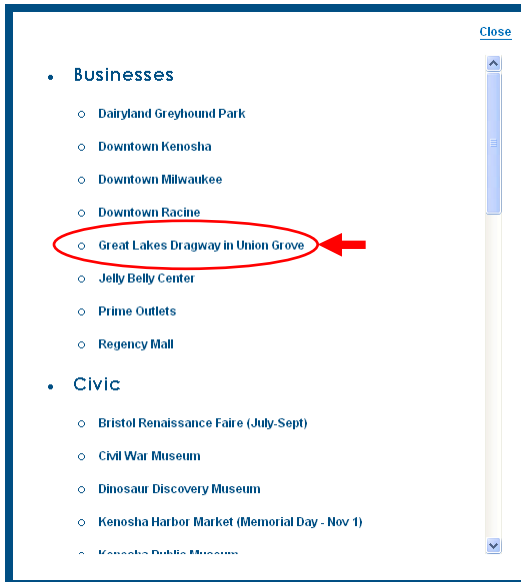
Option B – Select Point of Interest

To select a starting or ending point from a specific location, click on the “Point of Interest” button, next the “B” category.

<p>1 Start Fill in A, B, or C as your starting point</p> <p>A. Select a starting point within the <u>project limits</u>. <input type="button" value="Starting Point"/></p> <p>B. Select a point of interest near the corridor. <input type="button" value="Point of Interest"/></p> <p>C. Enter a Wisconsin address within the <u>project limits</u>. <input type="text" value="Address, City"/></p>
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This will pop-up a list of categorized places. Click on one of the locations as the starting or ending point. This will return to the website, highlighting and replacing the “Point of Interest” button with the name of the selected area.

To return to the website without selecting a starting location, click on “Close” or click any where outside the image.



To change the “Point of Interest”, click on the Option B button again.



Option C – Enter Address

A starting and ending point can also be selected by entering the address. Type in the Street and City for the starting or ending point in the text box, next to the “C” category. Make sure the address is within the project limits.

1 Start Fill in A, B, or C as your starting point

A. Select a starting point within the project limits.

B. Select a point of interest near the corridor.

C. Enter a Wisconsin address within the project limits.

2 End Fill in A, B, or C as your ending point


A. Select an ending point within the project limits.

B. Select a point of interest near the corridor.

C. Enter a Wisconsin address within the project limits.

Date of Travel

After selecting the starting and ending points, select the travel date. The most current date is selected as default. Either keep the current date or click on the text box or “Select” button to select a future date from the calendar. The maximum possible end date on the calendar will increase as the construction schedule is updated during the project.
